

VOCATION CORNER

Step into the heart of God's zeal and holiness with John 2: 13-22, where Jesus enters the Temple in Jerusalem during Passover and responds to defilement with righteous fervor. As He overturns the tables and drives out the merchants, Jesus calls us to recognize what stands in the way of authentic



worship and devotion. His actions reveal that the true Temple is not merely a building of stone and mortar, but His own body and, by extension each of us-sanctuaries of God's presence. This passage invites us to a vocation of holiness: to purify our hearts, guard our spiritual spaces from distraction and corruption, and allow God's presence to dwell fully within. As disciples, we are called to embody the Temple-to live faithfully, act justly, and honor the sacred in every aspect of life-transforming our inner world and the communities around us into places where God's glory is evident.
